- ☐ Children who live in a neighborhood that is safe, supportive and where they have not witnessed or experienced violence

- ☐ Minimum Quality of Care Index
 - Met medical home criteria
 - Had adequate and continues insurance
 - Received preventive medical care (16, 17, 19)

- Complexity of special health care needs
- One or more reported chronic of lifelong health conditions, 25
 - Children with a mental, emotional, developmental or behavioral problem, 3-17 years
 - · Children with a physical health problem

Caregiver/parent confidence child is ready to engage in

■ Child and adolescent is engaged in school, 6-17 years

Parent confidence level that the child to be ready to engage in

- Multiple chronic conditions: Child has two or more chronic or lifelong conditions
- Functional difficulties: Child has one or more of eleven frequent, chronic and/or serious functional difficulties
- Overall health status: Child had poor/fair overall health status
- ☐ Integrated Child Risk Index Social Health Risks
- ☐ Individual items for Social Health Risks
 - Food insecurity: Sometimes or often could not afford enough to eat
 - Economic Hardship: Somewhat often/very often hard to cover costs of basic needs, like food, housing
 - Neighborhood Safety/Violence: Lived in an unsafe neighborhood or where the child was a victim of or witnessed violence
 - Disadvantaged Due to Racism: Child has been treated or judged unfairly due to their race/ethnic group Integrated Child Risk Index Relational Health Risks item count
- ☐ Individual items for x Relational Health Risks
 - Multiple Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs): Exposed to two or more household level ACEs
 - Mental health status of child's primary caregiver(s)
 - High Parental Aggravation: Child's caregiver usually/always felt aggravated with child
 - Low Parent Coping/Emotional Support: Child's caregiver is not coping well and/or lacks emotional support for parenting
